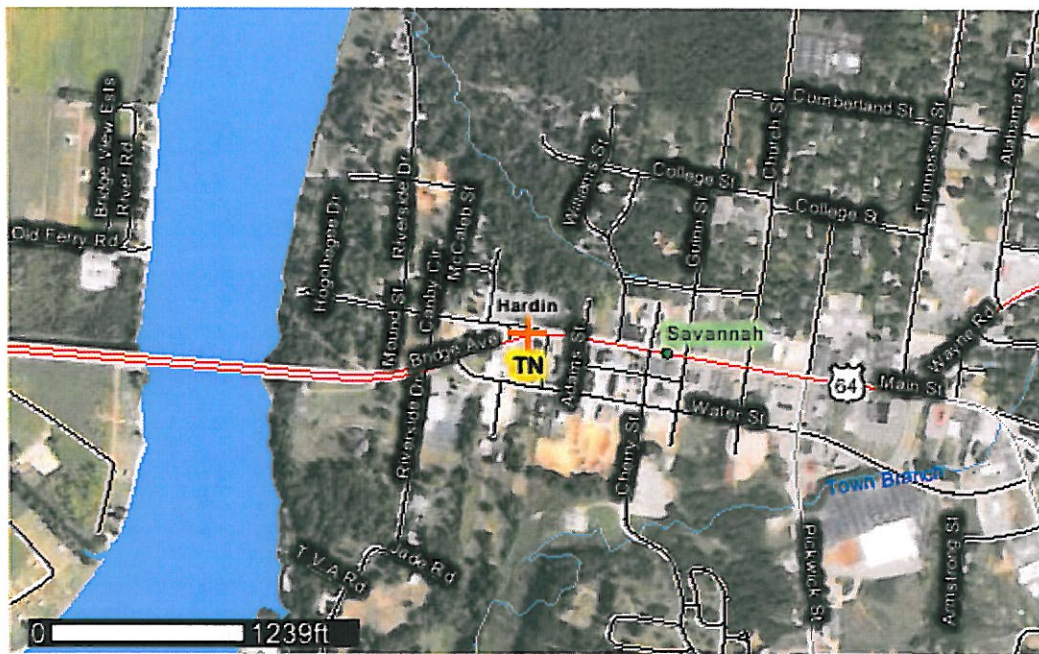
I. Type of Program to be funded by the JAG 4-year grant period.
Funding for this equipment is being sought from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program “to improve the functioning of the criminal justice system and to assist local . . . efforts to prevent or reduce crime and violence (OMB No. 1121-0323). The project period will extend from September 1, 2009 through September 30, 2013.

II. Statement of Need

The purpose of this grant application is to apply for funding to purchase the following law enforcement equipment: seven computers, one set of accident investigation software, and thirteen radios.

Savannah, Hardin County, Tennessee, is 5.73 square miles in size with a population of 7,030 and a population density of 1,268 people per square mile which is low. Savannah, Tennessee is located on the hilly banks of the Tennessee River. The per capita income for Savannah is \$15,101 and median income is \$22,779. There are 3,167 housing units in Savannah, Tennessee; 1,526 persons live below the poverty level. The current unemployment level is 12.4, which appears to be an indicator for higher numbers of domestic violence cases. Tax revenues are down and the police department budget is critically restricted. A copy of the budget is made a part of the application (2000 Census).

A map showing the terrain of the city and adjoining area follows. As you can see, the hilly terrain and the heavily forested areas of the city make excellent drug activity locations.

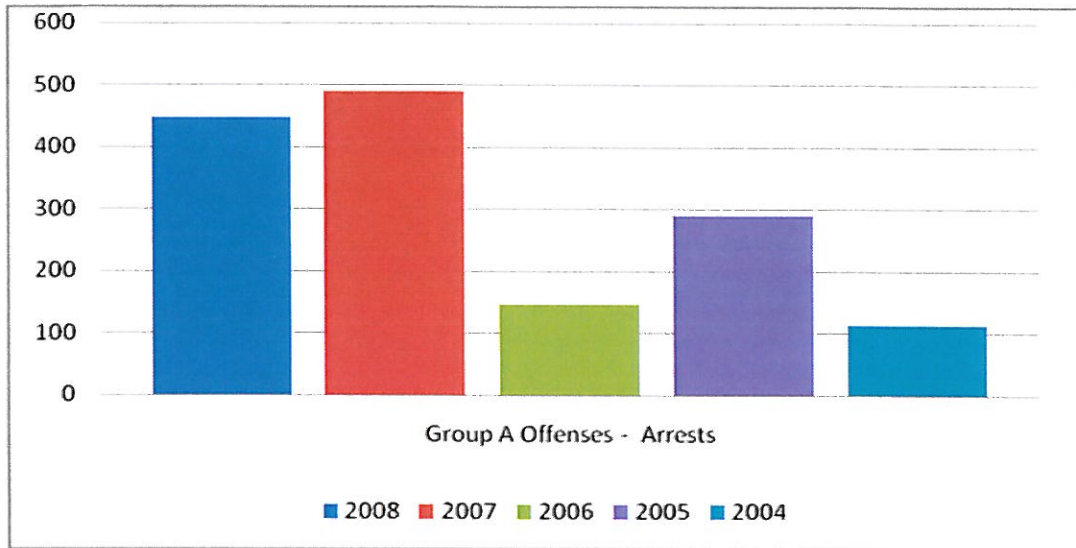

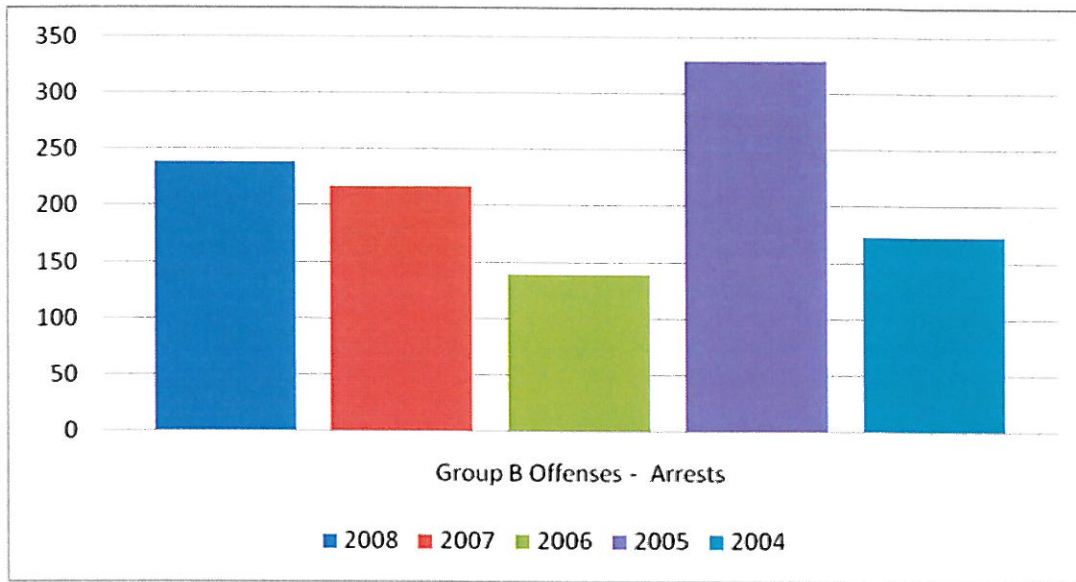

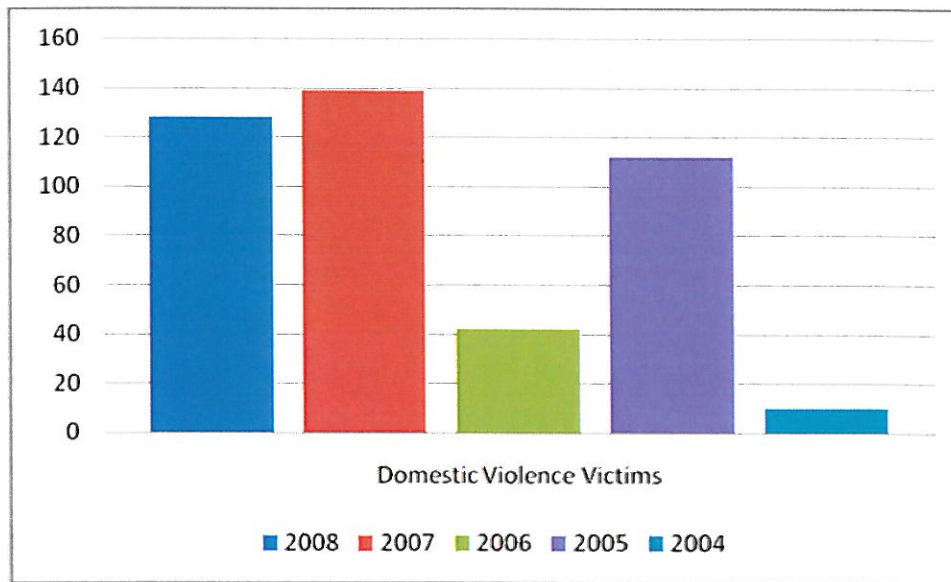

TIBRS classifies these crimes as Reported and Cleared - not arrests.

These crimes include Aggravated Assault, Simple Assault, Intimidation, Stalking, Forcible Fondling, and other Domestic Violence crimes.

During 2008 according to TIBRS, the offense review shows there were a total of 1467 offenses. Of those, 533 or 36.33% were cleared, and Group A Crimes per 100,000 population were 20,201.0.

The arrest overview shows 840 total arrests with 685 being adult arrests and 155 being juvenile arrests. Arrests per 100,000 population were 11,567.1, and the average number of offenses/incidents was 1.13 (TIBRS).

During 2007 according to TIBRS, the offense review shows there were a total of 1,424 offenses. Of those, 616 or 43.26% were cleared, and Group A Crimes per 100,000 population were 19,646.8.

The arrest overview shows 887 total arrests with 7078 being adult arrests and 180 being juvenile arrests. Arrests per 100,000 population were 12,237.9, and the average number of offenses/incidents was 1.16 (TIBRS).

During 2006 according to TIBRS, the offense review shows there were a total of 694 offenses. Of those, 210 or 30.33% were cleared, and Group A Crimes per 100,000 population were 9,638.9.

The arrest overview shows 330 total arrests with 284 being adult arrests and 46 being juvenile arrests. Arrests per 100,000 population were 4,583.3, and the average number of offenses/incidents was 1.16 (TIBRS).

During 2005 according to TIBRS, the offense review shows there were a total of 1,166 offenses. Of those, 402 or 34.5% were cleared, and Group A Crimes per 100,000 population were 16,351.1.

The arrest overview shows 719 total arrests with 620 being adult arrests and 99 being juvenile arrests. Arrests per 100,000 population were 10,082.7, and the average number of offenses/incidents was 1.17 (TIBRS).

During 2004 according to TIBRS, the offense review shows there were a total of 442 offenses. Of those, 151 or 34.2% were cleared, and Group A Crimes per 100,000 population were 6,194.8.

The arrest overview shows 321 total arrests with 286 being adult arrests and 35 being juvenile arrests. Arrests per 100,000 population were 4,498.9, and the average number of offenses/incidents was 1.14 (TIBRS).

Upon reviewing the numbers, it becomes apparent there was a major change in 2007: unemployment numbers increased dramatically.

There a number of contributing factors to the increase in crime such as the decline in employment; low high school graduation rates, 39% in persons 25 years of age and older, and accessibility of sites that lend themselves to drug use and production (2000 Census).

Savannah, Tennessee Police Department has a critical communications situation. They currently use computer systems more than five years old and have an inadequate amount of RAM, which severely limits the law enforcement software personnel can use. Opening the NCIS home page takes three minutes; this unacceptable.

Current accident investigation software is slow because of inadequate memory and is difficult to use. It is not compatible with investigative software used by other agencies.

Current radios lack the power necessary to communicate with other agencies. They have 12 channels; however, reception is a problem. The hilly and heavily forested terrain interferes with reception and transmissions are heavy with static. These radios are analog and will not function

after the June 2009 switch to digital transmission. It is crucial that the department get digital transmission radios.

III. Anticipated coordination efforts involving JAG related justice funds.

Savannah, Tennessee Police Department works with Hardin County Sheriff's Department when requested. The Police Department also works with other law enforcement agencies through a mutual aid agreement.

IV. Project Goals and Objectives

Outcome –

The purchase and installation of computers, radios, and software will preserve jobs in companies currently producing the products. Software will facilitate accident reporting and make the system more compatible with other law enforcement systems software.

B. Likelihood of achieving goals

This project is expected to be completed within six months from date of first draw down.

C. Organization capabilities and competencies

1. How organization will track all draw downs and grant expenditures separately from other federal funding.

Having received grant award notification, the Savannah, Tennessee Police Department will establish a separate checking account for this project. Each draw down will be backed by a vendor invoice on which is noted the payment check number and date paid. Also, a copy of the paid check front and back will be attached to the invoice.

Resumes for Police Chief Donald Derr, City Manager Garry Welch, and Grants Administrator Sylvia Mathis Palmer are a part of this application.

2. How activities can be started and completed expeditiously, and in a manner that maximizes job creation/economic benefits

According to City of Savannah procurement procedures, all purchases over \$10,000 must be publicly bid with the lowest and most responsive bid being accepted. Purchases between \$2,500 - \$10,000 require three telephone bids with the lowest and most responsive bid being accepted. The City of Savannah Police Department will publicly bid out the computers and the radios, which total \$21,750.00. The software, which costs \$200 will be procured using telephone bids. Chief Derr will write the specifications for the computers and the radios. Copies of the specifications will be posted at the Savannah Police Department, the Savannah City Hall, the Southwest Tennessee Development District, and on the City of Savannah Web Page. An ad will be placed in the Jackson Sun, which is printed daily, at least 30 days prior to the bid opening. A draft copy of the ad is made a part of this application. The bids will be opened, recorded, and evaluated. The bid will be awarded to the lowest and most responsive bidder. The city will place its order within 30 days from the bid opening. The vendor will deliver, install, and train all users within 60 days.






