


COVID-19

- Our main mission is to protect our community and employees from the Coronavirus.
 - All of this information and opening phase dates are subject to change due to guidance from the CDC, State Health Officials and Governor's office. If there is a large resurgence of the Virus then dates may be revised.
 - When there is no longer widespread community transmission and/or there is a vaccine available all facilities would go back to normal business protocols. A notification would be advertised at that time.

Phase One

City Park

- Playground to remain closed
- Pavilions available for groups of less than 10 persons (picnic tables will be limited)
- Athletic Facilities - Closed
- Disc Golf Course Open – Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines
- Passive Recreation – Walking, Biking, etc. Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines
- Tennis Courts Open- Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines
- Skate Park - Remains closed for maintenance
- All restroom facilities remain closed
- Water fountains - Turned off/unavailable

Wayne Jerrolds River Park

- Open - Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines with groups of less than 10 persons
- Pavilions limited to groups of less than 10 persons(picnic tables limited)
- Restroom facilities remain closed

Savannah Veterans Park

- Open- Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines with groups of less than 10 persons

 - Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines

- Restrooms open and are cleaned once daily (Water fountains – Turned off/unavailable)
- Concessions will remain closed

Hank Deberry Memorial Complex

- Open to Public for unorganized activities – Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines
 - No Game Play – practice and family use only
 - Users should avoid utilizing dugouts
 - Only one user/user group at a time
- Restrooms open and are cleaned once daily

- Open to Public for unorganized activities – Must follow social distancing and CDC guidelines
