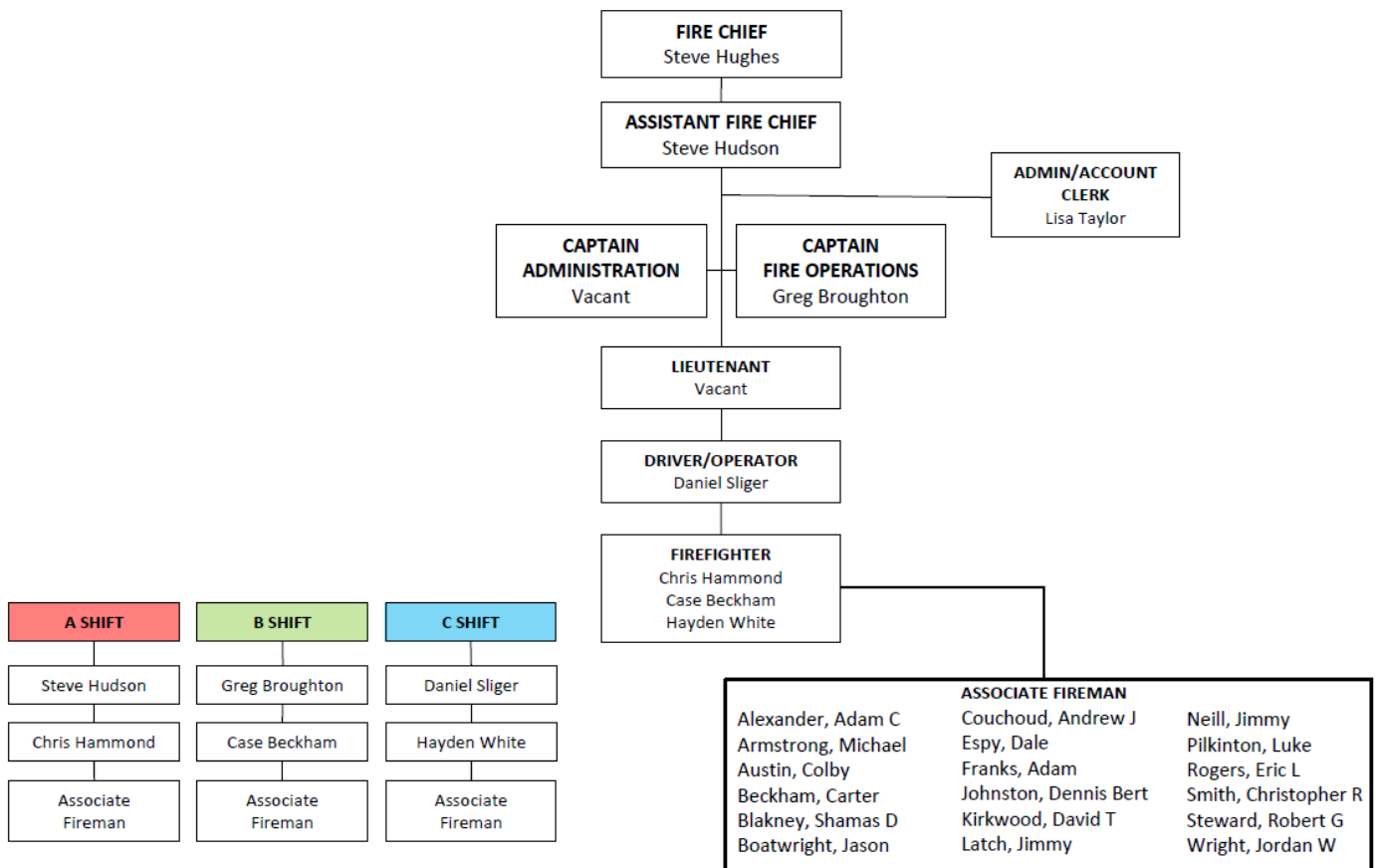

SAVANNAH FIRE DEPARTMENT ORGANIZATION CHART

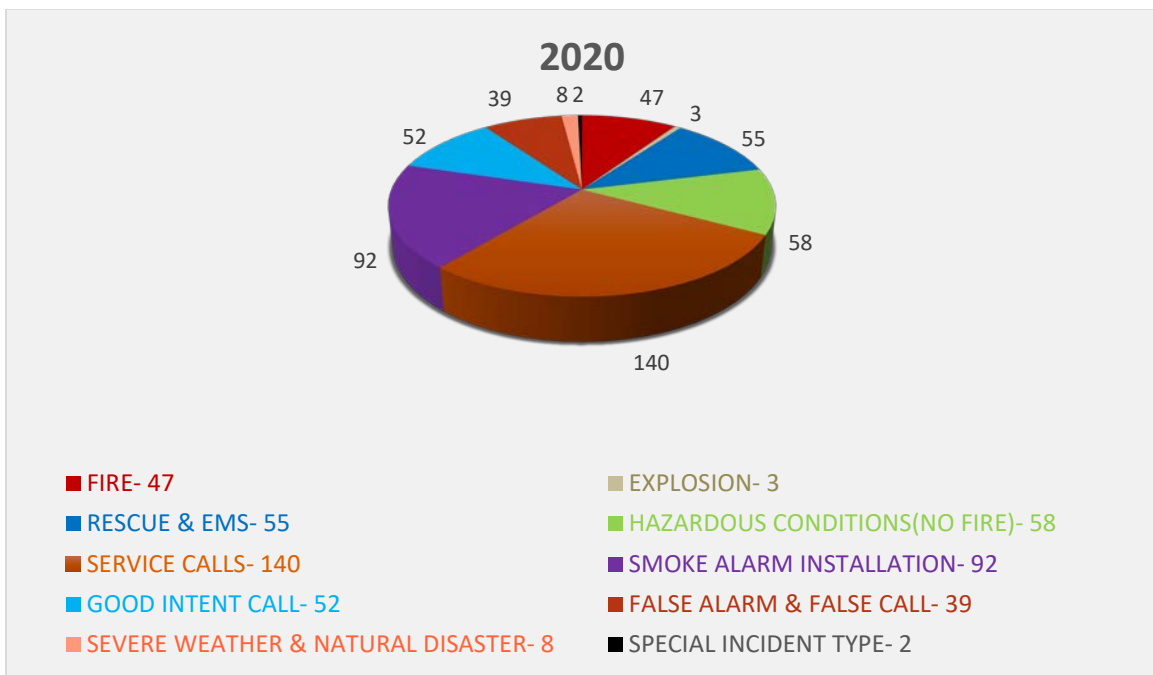

Expanded Incident Types

Fire. Includes fires out on arrival and gas vapor explosions (with extremely rapid combustion).

- 100 - Fire, other 2
- 111 - Building fire 10
- 112 - Fires in structure other than in a building 1
- 113 - Cooking fire, confined to container 4
- 118 - Trash or rubbish fire, contained 1
- 131 - Passenger vehicle fire 13
- 134 - Water vehicle fire 1
- 142 - Brush or brush-and-grass mixture fire 2
- 143 - Grass fire 1
- 151 - Outside rubbish, trash or waste fire 12

Overpressure Rupture, Explosion, Overheat (No Fire). Excludes steam mistaken for smoke.

- 251 - Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition 3

- 741 - Sprinkler activation, no fire - unintentional 3

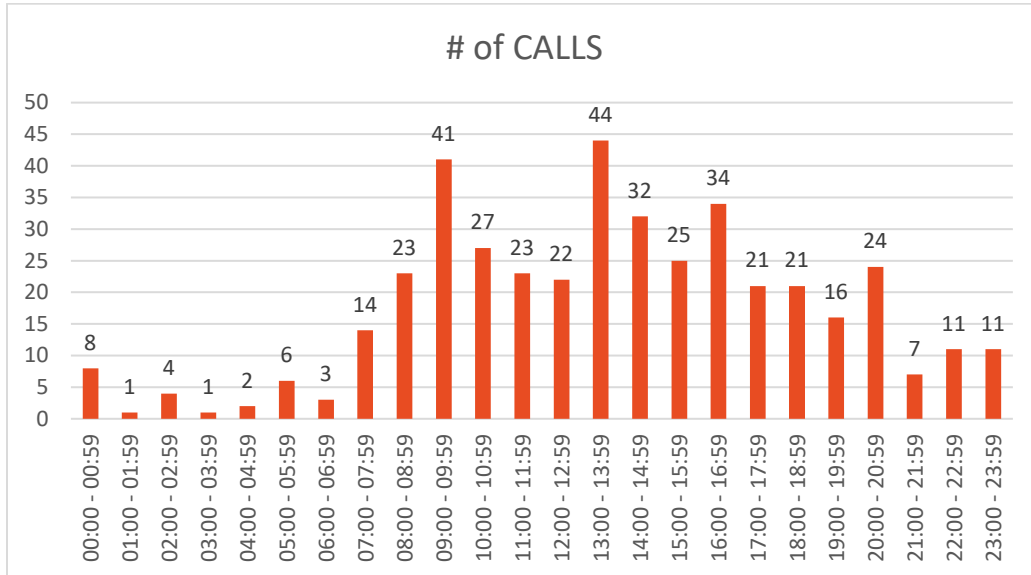

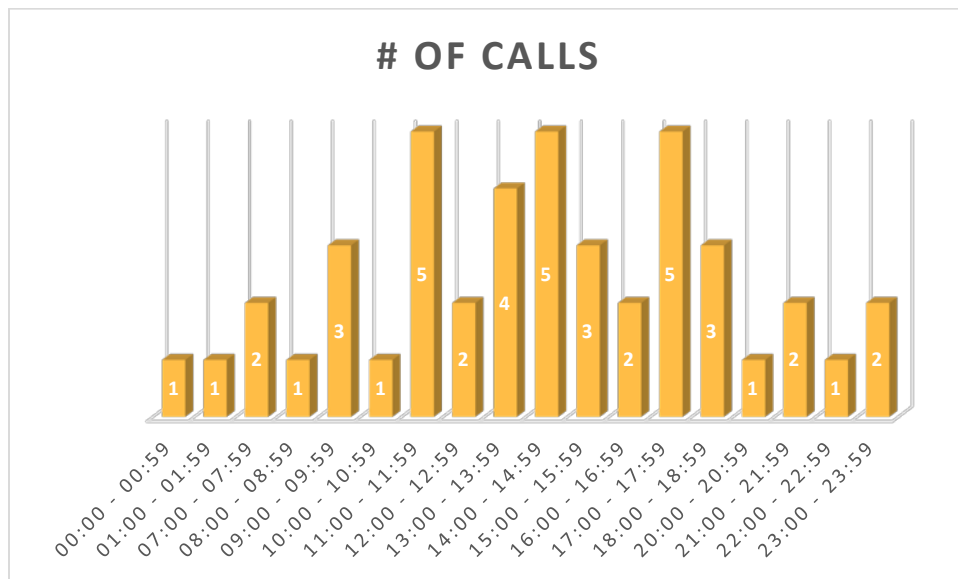


Calls by Time of Day

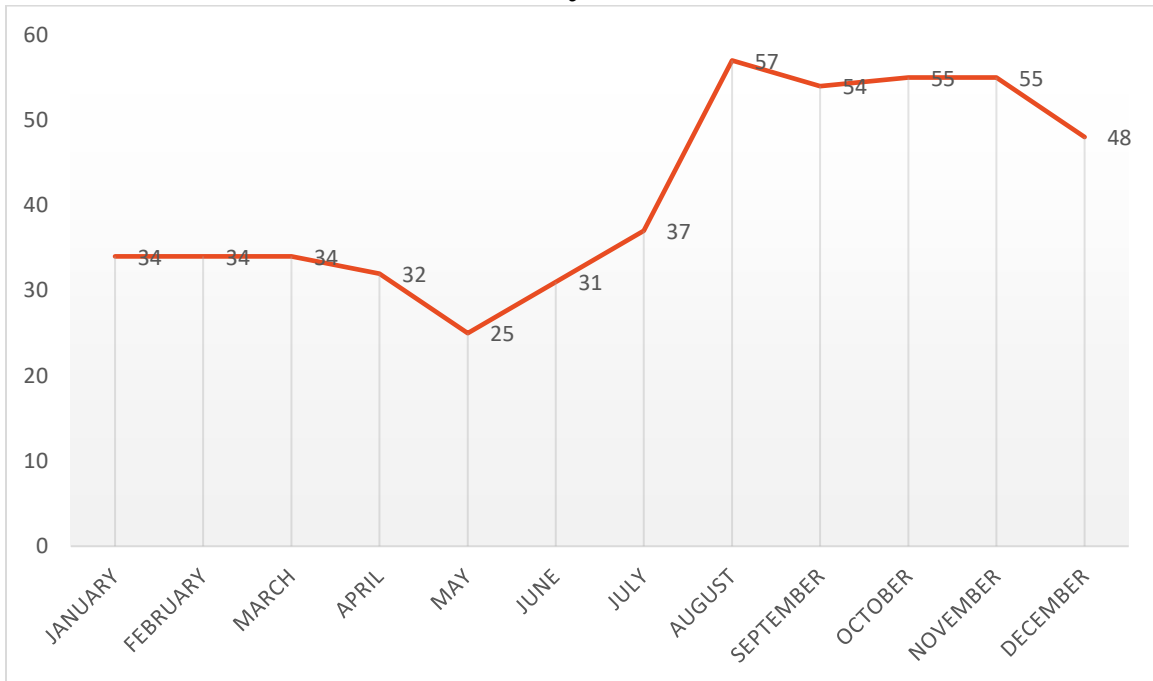
All Calls



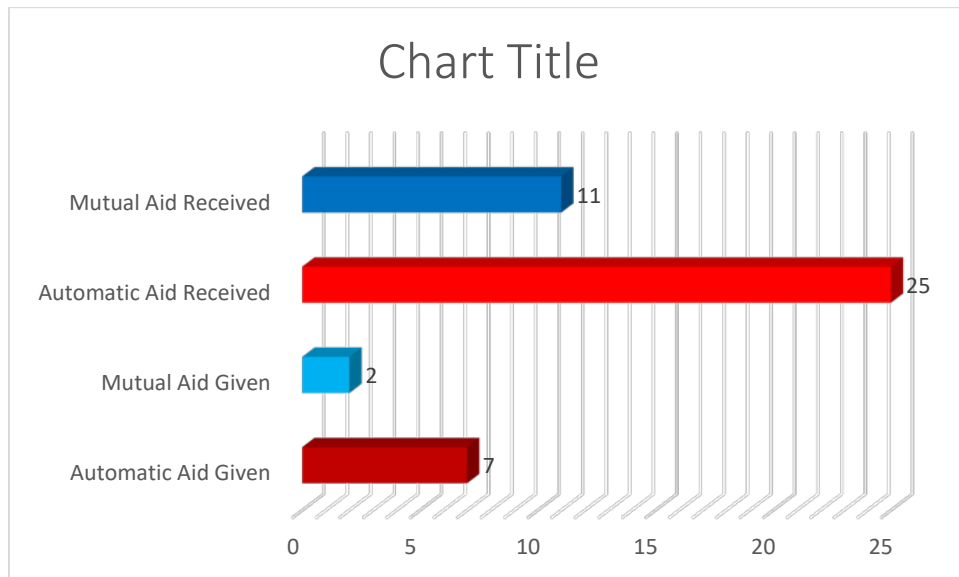
Fire Calls

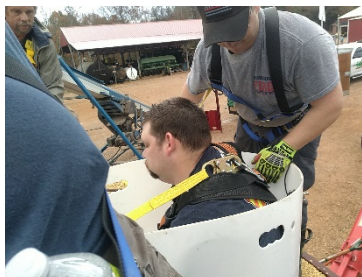

Fire Prevention Activities

The Department performed Fire Prevention & Safety education to approximately **3000** students and adults.

Topics discussed and handouts included;

- Kitchen safety
- Smoke detectors
- Portable heat sources
- Playing with matches/lighters
- Stop, Drop & Roll
- College dorm
- Etc.



Due to Covid-19 restrictions our fire prevention program was done quite differently this year. We sent all the materials for the teachers to preform the education in their class rooms.

We are still preforming teaching/outreach to the Culinary classes (fire safety and extinguishers) and presenting a class on fire investigation to the Law Enforcement class at the Hardin County High School.

Smoke Alarm Installation

The Fire Department installed **377** smoke detectors in **92** residences through the Tennessee State Fire Marshalls Get Alarmed Program.



"**Get Alarmed, TN!**" is a grant-funded fire safety education and smoke **alarm** installation program administered by the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO). Launched in November 2012, the program distributes fire safety education and 10-year sealed battery smoke alarms to participating fire departments.
