





Calls by Time of Day



New Service to the Community



On July 1st, 2024, the Savannah Fire Department started a new service to Residents of Savannah. We are now offering Emergency Medical Responder services. This is a healthcare professional trained to provide immediate, basic life-saving interventions to patients in emergency situations, including assessing the scene for safety, performing initial patient assessments, administering basic life support (BLS) like CPR, controlling bleeding, and preparing patients for transport by higher-level EMS.

Training

The members of the Fire Department strive to increase their knowledge and skills throughout the year.

Fire Prevention & Community Outreach Activities

The Department performed Fire Prevention & Safety education to approximately 4000 students and adults.

Topics discussed and handouts included;

Kitchen safety Smoke detectors Portable heat sources Playing with matches/lighters Stop, Drop & Roll College dorm Etc.



Twice a year our firefighters teach the Culinary classes fire safety, extinguisher use and CPR.



This class has proven its value through the actions of one of the students. She works at a local restaurant where a fire started in the deep fryer. The manager was going to pour water on this fire, and she stopped the manager and used a fire extinguisher to extinguish the fire. Had the Manager used water on this fire multiple burn injuries and/or the destruction of the building could have resulted.





Career Day

Every year the Savannah Fire Department has participated in the annual Career Day at Hardin County High School. We provide information on what it takes to become a firefighter. This information includes both the physical and mental requirements.



Smoke Alarm Installation

The Fire Department installed **289** smoke detectors in **75** residences through the Tennessee State Fire Marshalls Get Alarmed Program.





"Get Alarmed, TN!" is a grant-funded fire safety education and smoke alarm installation program administered by the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO). Launched in November 2012, the program distributes fire safety education and 10-year sealed battery smoke alarms to participating fire departments.
